I have a special love for English Literature/Composition College Preparedness, and second language learners at all levels.



Identified Gifted & Young Scholars

Giftedness manifests itself in an individual's ability to quickly grasp foundational skills/ fundamentals & begin imagining/hypothesizing or otherwise manipulating the 'data' to create/innovate.

Young Scholars facilitates academic skills & habits for All students. This program coming in the fall is great for students who seem to not quite meet the "assessment" profile for Gifted Identification yet show the drive and interest in their Learning. This is strongly encouraged for 5th Graders moving on to Middle school this year.

The Gifted Services form will allow for both Gifted and Young Scholars application; without the need to complete separate paperwork.



Identify students who, without opportunity, are less likely to pursue advanced levels of learning on their own.

 Nurture gifted potential at an early age in order to be prepared to engage in challenging subject matter and rigorous courses in K-12 and beyond.

- Often already knows, or...
- They learn material quickly and crave unique ways to apply skills
- Abstract thinker
- Makes unique connections
- Interest in problem solving
- Very curious
- Creatively approaches a task

- Mature debater
- Keen awareness of self, the community, the world, etc.
- Inquisitive often wants more than a simple answer
- Keen sense of humor or use of sarcasm

Multiple Pathways to Identification

- Mass screening tool at 2nd (NNAT-2) & at 4th (CogAT).
 - Objective measure to find historically underrepresented students who may not have advocates who understand how school "works"
- Referral
 - Teacher, Parent, Community or Self Referral

All pathways are equally as important and is the documentation that begins the ID process.

Referrals...


- When can you submit referrals?
 - Now!
 - Due April 1st
- What happens next?
 - After submitting referral, the holistic case study process begins
 - Data collection (student work samples, test data, review parent info form etc.)
 - Committee decides identification



Referrals Cont.- Holistic Case Study Approach


Students' strengths reported (Parent and Teacher)
